Prevent Shaken Baby Syndrome

R. Daryl Steiner, MD, director of Akron Children's Hospital's CARE (Children at Risk Evaluation) Center, hopes a new Ohio law will be a step forward in putting him out of business.

Dr. Steiner, a nationally-known child abuse expert, hopes that Claire's Law, which took effect Feb. 28, will help educate parents and other caregivers about the dangers of shaking a baby. Shaken Baby Syndrome, which is completely preventable, can result in death or brain damage leading to blindness, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, learning problems and other serious disabilities.

Since January 2007 to present, 36 cases of Shaken Baby Syndrome have been reported in Akron Children's Hospital's 25-county service area.

Claire's Law is named for Claire Fishpaw, a nine-year-old from Cincinnati, who was severely shaken by a babysitter when she was 11 months old. The trauma caused irreparable damage to the frontal lobe of her brain, which oversees speech, movement and aspects of her personality. Claire's parents, Jon and Michelle Fishpaw, have made it their mission to prevent other children from suffering a similar fate.

Claire's Law makes educational materials about Shaken Baby Syndrome available to the public. They are given to new parents before they leave the hospital with their new-

born babies and are available in physicians' offices, child care centers and on the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) website at <http://www.odh.ohio.gov>.

"I am hopeful that the legislation is effective in reducing the number of shaken babies," said Dr. Steiner, who served on the statewide committee which developed the educational materials in conjunction with Claire's Law. "All babies cry, but adult caregivers need to know they can walk away from the situation any time they are feeling frustrated or angry. No baby has ever died by crying in a safe place, such as a crib or playpen, for ten minutes or so."

Parents are encouraged to choose their baby's caregivers wisely and share with them the Shaken Baby Syndrome prevention materials found on the ODH website. Here are some other tips for parents and caregivers if they feel frustration, anger or the urge to shake a baby or toddler:

- Take several deep breaths and count to 100.
- Call a friend or relative for help.
- Go outside for fresh air.
- Wash your face or take a shower.
- Exercise. Do sit ups or climb the stairs a few times.
- Go in another room and turn on the TV or radio.
- Check on your baby every five or ten minutes.
- Understand that shaking a baby, even once, can

cause serious injury or death.

Akron Children's Hospital's CARE Center was established in 1987 as an offshoot of its Emergency Department in response to the increasing number of children being treated for suspected abuse or neglect. It was determined that these children's needs would be best met in a quiet, out-of-the-way place by a team of professionals with special training in identifying and caring for children who are the victims of physical, emotional or sexual abuse and neglect. Maple Days Breakfast

Camp Tuscazoar will host its sixth annual Maple Days breakfast on **April 4 and 5**. The breakfast menu will offer all-you-can-eat pancakes, sausage, applesauce, orange drink and samples of Camp Tuscazoar's maple syrup. As in previous years, the camp is producing maple syrup onsite. Plastic tubes transport sap from one or more taps on each maple tree (depending on the tree diameter) to collection tanks in the valley. The collected sap is then pumped through another plastic line up to the sugar shack, where an evaporator boils off water until the sap has been converted into syrup. Foundation volunteers then bottle the syrup for sale to the public.

Proceeds from the fund-raiser will help defray the cost of equipment and supplies. The maple syrup production area will be open for tours and demonstrations and gift baskets of syrup will also be available, along with baked goods prepared with our syrup. Bottles of Camp Tuscazoar's all-natural syrup will be available for purchase during the weekend as well.

"We are looking forward to another enjoyable Maple Days breakfast," said Bob Spencer, president of the Camp Tuscazoar Foundation. Bob said he had to replace the American and State flag at the flag pole in front of the building. 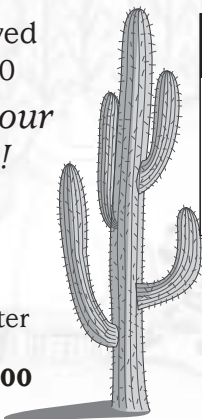

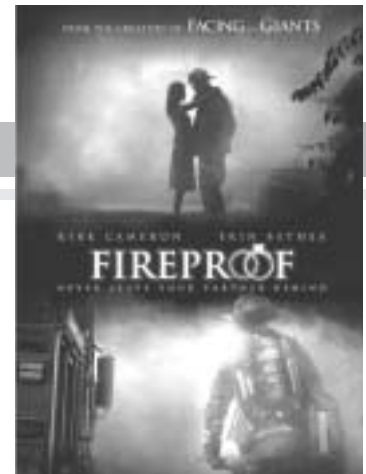

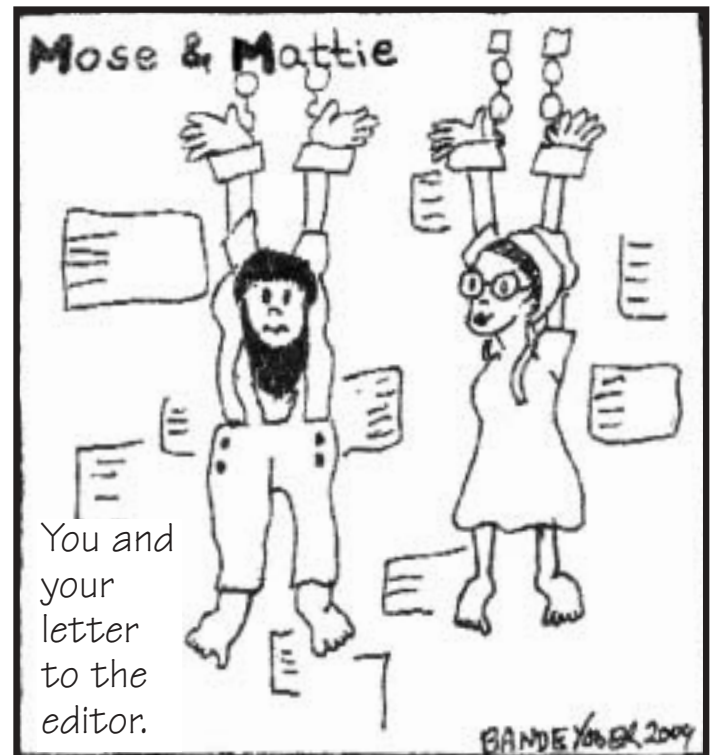
Residents of Navarre
